

Stuffed Turkeys

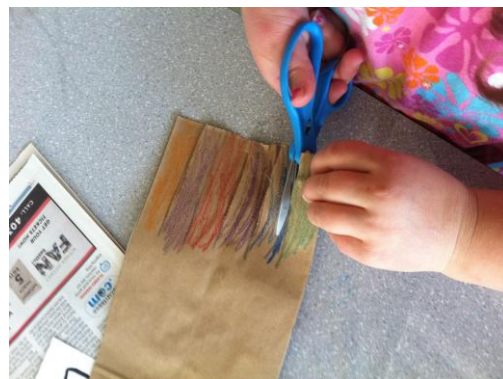


Materials Needed: paper lunch bags, turkey heads (copied on card stock), crayons, scissors, white glue, newspaper, yarn or string

1. Print and photocopy one turkey head for each student (see attached template).
2. Have students colour their turkey head and then their paper bag as shown below (about 2-3 inches down from the opening) to make the tail feathers:



3. Have students cut the paper bag in strips to make the tail.



4. Have students carefully open their paper bags. Then have them rip newspaper into small pieces, crumple it up and stuff it in the turkey body. Have students continue to stuff the body until it is half full.
5. Have students gather the paper bag in the middle (where the tail feathers start). Help them tie a piece of string or yarn around the bag to keep the stuffing in. Once done, have them spread the tail feathers apart.
6. Using white glue, have students glue their turkey head to the bag (on the "bottom" of the bag) and voilà! The turkey is finished!



7. Some of my students like to add feet out of either orange cardstock or pipe cleaners and glue them under their turkey.
